NEED TO KNOW TODAY

- This is the fourth time in the last eight years Providence has started the season 0-2-0-0. The previous two times, the team went on to make the postseason.
- Cameron Hughes had his first career multipoint game Saturday vs Laval.
- Mark McNeill has scored goals in each of the team's first two games of the season.
- Urho Vaakanainen, who was sent to Providence prior to their season opener, scored his first career point vs Hartford last Friday.
- After needing 47 games to score his first goal last season, Jeremy Lauzon scored a goal just two games into his sophomore campaign for the P-Bruins.
- Last season, McIntyre became the first P-Bruin ever to lead the AHL in shutouts (7). He is two shutouts away from tying Tim Thomas and Hannu Toivonen's Providence record of 11 shutouts wearing the "Spoked P". McIntyre is also six wins from tying John Grahame's franchise record with 67 victories in net.
- If Szwarc has a 20-goal season, he will be the fifth player in team history with three 20+ goal seasons in a Providence uniform (Cameron Mann, Sergejs Zoltoks, Andy Hilbert and Craig Cunningham).

Hey now, you're an All-Star

Czarnik, Binnington and head coach Jay Leach represented the Providence Bruins and the Atlantic Division at the 2018 AHL All-Star Classic. Czarnik scored two goals and an assist while Binnington stopped 8 of 11 shots he faced. Binnington was also named Top Goaltender of the Skills competition.

Leading the League

Czarnik finished 3rd in the AHL in scoring and 4th in power play goals. Szwarc and Cross were tied for 5th in the AHL in rating with Szwarc ranking 1st among AHL forwards. McIntyre led the league in shutouts and was 4th in wins. Binnington was 2nd in GAA and 4th in save percentage.

- Signed a 3-year entry-level contract with Boston that started at the beginning of the 2016-17 season.
- Finished 2015-16 with a 12-12-4 record for the Chicago Steel of the United States Hockey League, posting a 2.31 GAA and .920 save % (both fifth in the USHL) in addition to three shutouts.
- Previously played for HC Klando (Czech U20) prior to his time with Chicago, playing 29 games with a 2.78 GAA and a .926 save %.
- Represented the Czech Republic at the most recent 2016 and 2017 World Junior Championship.
- Made AHL debut October 26, 2016 in a 4-3 OT road loss to the Toronto Marlies. Just two days later, he picked up his first AHL victory in a 4-2 win against the Utica Comets.
- Recorded first AHL shutout March 25 in Albany, a 5-0 win. He stopped all 34 shots he faced.
- Spent a majority of 2016-17 with Atlanta, but made five stints with Providence in his rookie season.
- Recalled on emergency basis April 19 by Boston to serve as the team's third goalie in the playoffs.
- Spent the majority of 2017-18 with Atlanta as their primary goaltender, going 16-18-1 with a 2.96 GAA and save percentage of 91.1%. Also saw three games of AHL action with Providence, going 2-1 with 1.96 GAA and 92.9% save percentage.

- Played for the Fargo Force of the USHL from 2010-2012 where he was named the USHL Goaltender of the Year, USHL First All-Star Team, and USHL Best Save Percentage (.921) in 2012.
- Played 3 seasons for University of N. Dakota from 2012-15. Was NCHC First Team All-Star, NCHC Goaltender of the Year and NCAA 2nd All-American his junior year. Hobey Baker award finalist.
- Forwent senior season to join Providence for the 2015-16 season, making his AHL debut October 9, 2015 against the Wilkes-Barre Scranton Penguins.
- Started 2016-17 in Providence and made NHL debut October 25 in relief against Minnesota.
- AHL Goaltender of the Month for December 2016, going 9-0-0 with a 1.65 GAA and 94.7 save %.
- Recorded first AHL shutout February 26 vs Springfield, stopping 25 shots in a 3-0 win.
- Career high 50 saves on 51 shots in the decisive Game 5 of the 2017 Atlantic Division Semifinals against the Wilkes-Barre Scranton Penguins.
- Finished 2016-17 first in save percentage and second in GAA in the AHL and was named to the AHL's Second All-Star Team. He was also named to the 2017 AHL All-Star Classic roster and had event-best .923 SV% (12 saves on 13 shots).
- Re-signed to a 2-year, two way deal with Boston as a restricted free agent July 14, 2017. He set a career high in minutes and games played during the 2017-18 season while becoming the first P-Bruin ever to lead the AHL in shutouts.

- Drafted 18th overall by Boston in 2017 and signed a three-year entry-level contract with them June 13, 2018.
- Has twice represented his home country of Finland at the World Junior Championship. In 2018 he recorded an assist and plus-three rating in five games. In 2017 he played in six contests registering a goal.
- Played final season in Finnish Elite League in 2017-18 with SaiPa, leading his team's defensemen with a plus-eight rating. He scored 11 points in 43 games and in nine playoff games had an assist.
- Spent 2016-17 with JYP of SM-Liiga playing in 41 games, tallying two goals and four assists along with a rating of plus-five while adding three helpers in 14 playoff games.
- Played first season in SM-Liiga with the Espoo Blues, scoring a goal and five assists in 25 games.
- Won two medals with Team Finland in the Under-18 World Junior Championship, claiming gold in 2016 while registering three points in seven games and silver in 2017 when he totaled three goals and three assists for six points in five games.
- His father, Harri Vaakanainen, coached Tuukka Rask in Finland.
- Assigned to Providence prior to their 2018 opener, and scored his first professional point that night.

- Captain of Quinnipiac as a Senior and finished his collegiate career with 19 goals and 37 assists for 56 points in 284 games. He also had 186 PIM and a +39 rating over his four years with the Bobcats.
- Named 2016 ECAC Hockey Tournament Most Outstanding Player during junior season in addition to the All-Tournament Team and All-Frozen Four Team. He set career highs with seven goals and 21 assists for 28 points and was tied for third among ECAC defensemen in all three categories. He led Quinnipiac with 11 assists and 12 points in the playoffs.
- As a Freshman in 2013-14 he had the second-best plus/minus rating (+17) on the team and his five goals scored were the most for a Quinnipiac defenseman. Also joined the team with his brother, Tim.
- Joined Quinnipiac directly from the U.S. National Developmental Team. In 25 games with Team USA in 2012-13, Clifton scored three goals with six assists while posting a +11 rating. He also suited up for Team USA in the World U-18 Tournament where his only goal came in the final game vs Canada.
- Did not sign after being drafted by the Coyotes in 2013 and shortly after becoming an unrestricted free agent signed a deal with the Providence Bruins August 16, 2017.
- Made pro debut October 7 vs Springfield, earned first career point November 19 vs Hershey and scored first pro goal December 9 against Utica. He finished the year second among the team's rookie blueliners in scoring and ended the season strong by posting 10 points after February 9.
- Re-signed with the organization May 3, 2018 on a two-year NHL deal.

Jay Leach, Head Coach

Jay Leach was named the 12th head coach of the Providence Bruins on July 31, 2017 after serving as an assistant coach for the team during the 2016-17 season. The former captain of the P-Bruins and Providence College Friars enters his second season as an AHL head coach and is the third former Providence captain to serve as the team's head coach (Peter Laviolette and Bill Armstrong). Leach, 39, served as assistant coach of the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins in 2015-16, helping them advance to the quarterfinals of the 2016 Calder Cup Playoffs. He was an assistant coach for Adler Mannheim of the Deutsche Eishockey Liga (DEL) in Germany in 2014-15 and helped lead that team to the league title.

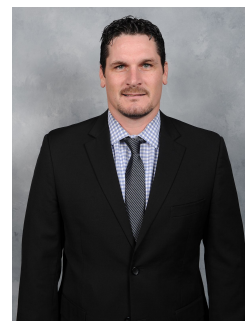


A native of Syracuse, New York, Leach was originally selected 115th overall by the Arizona Coyotes in the fifth round of the 1998 NHL Entry Draft and played 11 professional seasons from 2001-13. He appeared in 70 NHL games with New Jersey, San Jose, Montreal, Tampa Bay and Boston, registering a goal and two assists with 60 penalty minutes. The defenseman also compiled 25 goals and 62 assists for 87 points with 608 penalty minutes and a plus-34 rating at the AHL level with the Albany Devils, Worcester Sharks, Lowell Devils, Portland Pirates, Norfolk Admirals, Providence Bruins, Bridgeport Sound Tigers and Springfield Falcons. In addition to captaining Providence from 2005-07, he served as captain of the Worcester Sharks in 2010-11 and the Albany Devils in 2012-13. He finished his P-Bruins career with 11 goals and 21 assists for 32 points in 209 games with 324 penalty minutes and a +17 rating.

Prior to his professional career, Leach played four seasons at Providence College from 1997-2001. As a senior in 2000-01, he served as team captain and established career highs with four goals and 21 assists for 25 points in 40 games. Overall he suited up in 142 games for the Friars, totaling six goals and 46 assists for 52 points while amassing 276 penalty minutes.

Trent Whitfield, Assistant Coach

Trent Whitfield, 41, is in year three as an assistant coach with Providence. He served as an assistant coach of the Calgary Hitmen of the Western Hockey League (WHL) in 2015-16 and the previous season was an assistant coach of the Portland Pirates of the AHL.



Whitfield enjoyed a 15-year playing career in the ECHL, AHL and NHL. He skated in 194 NHL games with Boston, St. Louis, Washington and N.Y. Rangers, compiling 11 goals and 18 assists for 29 points with 104 penalty minutes. He also made 18 NHL playoff appearances including four with Boston. He played 812 games at the AHL level with the P-Bruins, Peoria Rivermen and Portland Pirates totaling 247 goals and 349 assists for 596 points with 564 penalty minutes. Whitfield was an alternate captain of HC Bolzano in the Austrian Hockey League in 2013-14, recording 14 goals and 32 points in 54 games.

Whitfield served as a captain on six teams, in addition to his one season as an alternate captain for HC Bolzano in 2013-14. He wore the "C" for the P-Bruins from 2009-13, for the Peoria Rivermen in 2008-09 and for the Spokane Chiefs (WHL) in 1996-97. The Alameda, Saskatchewan native was originally selected by the Bruins in the fourth round (100th overall) of the 1996 NHL Entry Draft.

Ryan Mouganel, Assistant Coach

Mouganel, 42, has spent the last four seasons as an assistant coach with San Jose's AHL affiliates. He began working under head coach Roy Sommer in 2014 with the Worcester Sharks and kept his role as when the franchise relocated to San Jose as the Barracuda. Mouganel's teams made the playoffs each of those seasons highlighted by a Pacific Division Championship and run to the Conference Finals in 2017. His first taste of AHL coaching experience came in 2013-14 as an assistant coach with Hershey.



The native of Scarborough, Ontario got his coaching start in the ECHL with the Fresno Falcons from 2005-2009. Working as the assistant coach, his team made the postseason in each of his first three seasons. He then moved on to become the head coach of the ECHL's Las Vegas Wranglers from 2009-13. The Wranglers qualified for the postseason with Mouganel at the helm in each of his four seasons, highlighted by a run to the Finals in 2011-12. He was a head coach in the 2011 ECHL All Star game and was promoted to General Manager of Las Vegas during his final ECHL season.

Prior to coaching, Mouganel played parts of six pro seasons between the AHL and ECHL. His lone season of AHL action came with Rochester in 1999-00, suiting up in 20 games for the Amerks registering a goal. He spent five years in the ECHL from 1997-03 with Atlantic City, Chesapeake, Hampton Roads and Jackson scoring 105 points (46g-59a) and 271 penalty minutes over 180 games. He was part of Atlantic City's 2003 Kelly Cup Championship team, scoring a goal and eight assists over 17 playoff games.
