Julien BriseBois – General Manager, Syracuse Crunch | General Manager, Tampa Bay Lightning

Julien Brisebois was named the seventh general manager in Lightning history on September 11, 2018. He is responsible for all Lightning hockey operations, including the coaching and scouting staffs, player procurement and development, as well as minor league affiliations and operations. Also serving as alternate governor, he reports directly to chairman and governor Jeff Vinik.

Prior to being promoted to that position, BriseBois spent eight seasons as assistant general manager under Steve Yzerman. In that position BriseBois assisted in all aspects of player personnel decisions, player development, analytics, contract preparation and negotiation, collective bargaining agreement interpretation and compliance, as well as salary arbitration for the Lightning and the Syracuse Crunch of the American Hockey League, for whom he also served as general manager. In that role BriseBois was also part of the AHL's competition committee and served as the chairman of the AHL Player Development Committee.

As general manager of the Lightning's top affiliate, the Syracuse Crunch and the Norfolk Admirals before that, BriseBois has been the architect of teams that reached the Calder Cup Finals three times during his tenure, including winning the championship in 2012 in Norfolk. With the Lightning's emphasis on drafting and development, the Crunch play an integral role in Tampa Bay's success. During BriseBois' tenure overseeing the Lightning's top minor league affiliate, they have produced two AHL most valuable players, two defencemen of the year and have graduated numerous key players including most of the Lightning's roster that has reached the Eastern Conference Final in three of the last four seasons, including a trip to the 2015 Stanley Cup Final, as well as head coach Jon Cooper. During the 2011-12 season, BriseBois' Norfolk Admirals set a professional sports record with a 28-game winning streak that propelled Norfolk to the AHL's best regular season record. The team's regular season success continued in the playoffs as the Admirals went on to win the organization's first Calder Cup, the first championship by a Lightning AHL affiliate. BriseBois was instrumental in helping build the organization's depth with signings that proved instrumental to both the Lightning and the Admirals, demonstrated by nine players being recalled to Tampa Bay during that season. In 2010-11 the Hockey News recognized BriseBois as the top hockey executive under 40 years of age in their "Top 40 Under 40" listing.

Prior to coming to Tampa Bay, BriseBois, 41, spent nine seasons with the Montreal Canadiens after joining the organization on September 1, 2001 as director of legal affairs. In July of 2003 he added director of hockey operations to his duties before being named vice president of hockey operations on July 24, 2006. In this capacity, BriseBois oversaw the Canadiens' AHL affiliate, the Hamilton Bulldogs. The Bulldogs went on to win the 2007 Calder Cup during the first season under BriseBois' direction. On August 23, 2007 BriseBois was named the general manager of the Hamilton Bulldogs, making him the youngest in the AHL at the time. During that time he retained his position with the Canadiens.

A native of Greenfield Park, Quebec, BriseBois was employed by the Heenan Blaikie law firm before joining the Canadiens. During that time he worked in the field of sports law, where he represented several NHL and Major League Baseball clubs in arbitration cases as well as acting as an advisor in contract negotiations. BriseBois also participated in the reform of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League.

BriseBois is a graduate of the University Of Montreal Faculty Of Law and earned a Master's degree in business administration from the John Molson School of Business at Concordia University. He is a member of the Quebec Bar, the American Bar Association and the Sports Lawyers Association.

Benoit Groulx — Head Coach (3rd Season)

Groulx, 50, enters his third season as head coach of the Crunch after he was hired on May 10, 2016. In his first season in Syracuse, Groulx coached the Crunch to the franchise's second Calder Cup Finals appearance. Under his leadership, the Crunch won the North Division with a 38-24-7-7 regular season mark before rolling through the Eastern Conference playoffs with an 11-5 record through the first three rounds. The Crunch were defeated by the Grand Rapids Griffins in the 2017 Calder Cup Finals, four games to two.

In his second season with the Crunch, Groulx guided a rookie-laden team team to the best regular season in franchise history, posting a 46-22-3-5 record. It was the third time in franchise history the team reached 100 points and their 0.658 points percentage was the best in team history. In the playoffs, Groulx's team earned a first-round sweep, giving them a playoff series win in back-to-back years for the first time in team history. It was also the first time the Crunch have won a playoff series in the same year as their NHL affiliate. Through two seasons, Groulx holds an 84-46-10-12 record with the Crunch. His 0.625 points percentage is second among head coaches in franchise history behind Jon Cooper (0.662).

He had been the head coach and general manager for the Gatineau Olympiques of the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League during the 2015-16 season, guiding his team to a record of 46-19-2-1. The Olympiques were defeated in the 2016 QMJHL Quarter-Final by the Moncton Wildcats four games to two.

Groulx has worked 13 total seasons as a head coach in the QMJHL with the Hull/Gatineau Olympiques, posting a career record of 460-293-18-59. He led his teams to league championships in 2003, 2004 and 2008, earning QMJHL Coach of the Year honors for the 2003-04 season while coaching the Olympiques.

The Hull, Quebec native also served on the coaching staffs for Team Canada at the 2004 U18 World Championships as well as the 2014 and 2015 IIHF World Junior Championships. Groulx was an assistant coach for the Gold Medal winning Team Canada at the U18 World Championships in 2004. Groulx was also an assistant coach for Team Canada at the World Junior Championships in 2014 as Canada was defeated in the Bronze Medal game by Russia. The following year, Groulx was the head coach for Team Canada, winning the Gold Medal and earning a perfect 7-0 record during the tournament.

Groulx also has two years of head coaching experience in the American Hockey League with the Rochester Americans (2008-09, 2009-10), compiling a record of 73-76-11 while leading the Americans to one Calder Cup playoffs appearance.

Groulx is the ninth head coach in Syracuse Crunch history, replacing Rob Zettler, who had been the team's head coach for three and one-half seasons. Zettler replaced Jon Cooper, the first head coach of the Crunch's Lightning era, March 25, 2013.

Ken Klee — Assistant Coach (2nd Season)

Klee, 47, enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Crunch after spending two years as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team, where he won two consecutive world championships in 2015 and 2016. With the Crunch, Klee works closely with the team's defense and penalty kill. Under his guidance, the Crunch allowed fewer than 200 goals for only the second time in team history in 2017-18.

An Indianapolis, Indiana native, Klee skated in 934 NHL games over 14 seasons, the majority of which was spent with the Washington Capitals. The defenseman's NHL career spanned from 1994 to 2009 and he accumulated 195 points (55g, 140a) with the Capitals, Toronto Maple Leafs, New Jersey Devils, Colorado Avalanche, Atlanta Thrashers, Anaheim Ducks and Phoenix Coyotes.

In addition to his NHL experience, Klee played in 191 games in the American Hockey League for Baltimore Skipjacks and Portland Pirates. Klee was drafted by the Capitals in the ninth round, 177th overall, in the 1990 NHL Entry Draft.

Gilles Bouchard — Assistant Coach (1st Season)

Bouchard, 47, joins the Crunch as an assistant coach in 2018-19 after spending the previous five seasons with the Rouyn-Noranda Huskies in the QMJHL. He compiled a 204-104-32 record for the Huskies, capturing the QMJHL championship for the first time in franchise history in 2016. He won the QMJHL's Maurice Filion Trophy for General Manager of the Year and the Ron-Lapointe Trophy for Coach of the Year for the 2015-16 season.

The Normandin, Quebec native won a silver medal as the Head Coach of Team Canada Red at the 2017 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge.

As a player, Bouchard spent three seasons in the QMJHL from 1988 to 1991 with Shawinigan, Trois-Rivières, Beauport and Chicoutimi. He also played two seasons with the Université de Québec à Trois-Rivières, claiming the Queen's Cup in 1996, followed by a four-year stint in the QSPHL with Louiseville, Asbestos and Thetford Mines from 1996 to 2000.

He replaced Jeff Halpern on the Crunch staff after Halpern was promoted to the same position with the Tampa Bay Lightning.

Karl Goehring — Goaltending & Video Coach (2nd Season)

Goehring, 40, returns to Syracuse for his second season after being hired as the team's goaltending and video coach on July 12, 2017. He had been a volunteer assistant coach with his alma mater, the University of North Dakota, for seven seasons, starting in 2010. During his time as an assistant coach at North Dakota, the university made four Frozen Four appearances (2011, 2014, 2015, 2016) and won one National Championship (2016). Under his tutelage, Zane McIntyre won the Mike Richter Award as the NCAA's top goaltender, in 2014-15.

In his first season back with the Crunch, Goehring worked with seven goaltenders who saw action in a game for the Crunch, a single-season franchise record. Under Goehring, Crunch goaltenders finished with a 2.27 goals-against average, which ranked second in the AHL, and a .915 save percentage, which was fifth in the league.

During his playing career, the Apple Valley, Minnesota native had two stints with the Crunch, from 2001-2005 and 2007-08. He holds the franchise record for wins (78) and games played by a goaltender (177). In four seasons as the netminder at the University of North Dakota, Goehring led the program to a National Championship in 2000 and an appearance in the championship game in 2001. He holds the program record for wins (80), winning percentage (.756) and shutouts (15).

Goehring replaced David Alexander, who took a similar position with the NHL's St. Louis Blues.
