Chris Drury (General Manager): Named Wolf Pack general manager May 16, 2017...Has served as NY Rangers assistant general manager since September 2, 2016...Rejoined Ranger organization as Director of Player Development September 4, 2015...Played 12 seasons as an NHL forward from 1998-99 through 2010-11, with Colorado, Calgary, Buffalo and the Rangers, amassing career totals of 255-360-615 in 892 GP...Won Stanley Cup with Colorado in 2000-01, scoring second-most playoff goals in NHL (11-5-16 in 23 GP)...Earned NHL Rookie-of-the-Year honors in 1998-99 (20-24-44 in 79 GP with Avalanche)...Had nine 20-goal seasons during his career, and reached the 50-point mark eight times...Made nine playoff appearances, and helped his teams advance as far as the conference finals six times...Skated in 135 career Stanley Cup Playoff games (47-42-89)...Played four seasons (2007-08 through 2010-11) as a Ranger (62-89-151 in 264 GP), after signing with New York as a free agent July 1, 2007...Served as Ranger captain for three years (2008-09 through 2010-11), after being named the 25th captain, and second American-born captain, in franchise history October 3, 2008...Played four seasons in Hockey East at Boston University, 1994-95 through 1997-98 (113-101-214 in 155 career GP), and finished his career as school's all-time leader in goals, and ranked third all-time in points...Helped lead BU to NCAA title as a freshman in 1994-95...Also reached the NCAA championship game with the Terriers in 1996-97, and went to Frozen Four in 1995-96...Won Hobey Baker Award as a senior in 1997-98, his third time as a finalist for the honor, becoming the first player in BU history to be so honored...Inducted into U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 2015...Skated for USA in three consecutive Winter Olympics (2002, 2006 and 2010), winning Silver Medals in 2002 in Salt Lake City, Utah and 2010 in Vancouver, B.C....Born August 20, 1976 in Trumbull, CT.

Kris Knoblauch (Head Coach): Named the seventh head coach in Wolf Pack history July 29, 2019...Spent 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons as an assistant coach with NHL's Philadelphia Flyers...Was a head coach at Major Junior level for seven years (2010-11 through 2016-17), amassing a total record of 298-130-16-13 (.684) in 457 games...Led Erie Otters (OHL) to four consecutive 50-win campaigns (2013-14 through 2016-17), a first in the history of the CHL (OHL, QMJHL and WHL)...Recorded total record with Erie of 216-79-9-5 (.722) in 309 games...Won OHL championship, and went to Final game of Memorial Cup, with Erie in 2016-17...Guided Erie to OHL's best 2015-16 regular-season record (52-15-1-0, 105 pts.), earning OHL Coach of the Year honors...Captured OHL, and earned Memorial Cup berth, in 2014-15 (50-14-2-2, 104 pts.)...Named Erie head coach November 29, 2012...Piloted WHL's Kootenay Ice as head coach for two seasons (2010-11 and 2011-12), compiling a total record of 82-47-78...In his first year with Kootenay, led the team to a 46-21-1-4 regular-season record and a 16-3 playoff run, good for WHL title and a trip to the Memorial Cup...Among the players he coached in Erie or Kootenay are: Connor McDavid, Alex DeBrincat, Sam Reinhart, Dylan Strome, Andre Burakovsky, Anthony Cirelli, Erik Cernak, Connor Brown and Travis Dermott...Served three seasons (2007-08 through 2009-10) as a Kootenay assistant coach and one year (2006-07) as an assistant with the Prince Albert Raiders of the WHL...International coaching experience includes a silver medal with Canada at 2017 World Junior Championship as an assistant coach and a head-coaching role with Canada-Red at the 2015 World U17 Hockey Challenge...Played two seasons of pro hockey, including 60 games with the Austin IceBats of the CHL in 2004-05 (18-22-40, 76 PIM) and 28 GP in 2005-06 with Neuilly sur-Marne of FFHG Division 1 in France (29-17-46, 24 PIM)...Drafted in 7th round (166th overall) by the New York Islanders in 1997...Skated for five seasons (1999-00 through 2003-04) with

Pat Boller (Assistant General Manager): Added assistant general manager duties to his title prior to 2012-13 season...Currently in his 13th year on the Wolf Pack staff...Served 10 seasons (2007-08 through 2016-17) as a Wolf Pack assistant coach...Spent nine seasons with the parent New York Rangers as a coaches' assistant and Director of Operations of the Madison Square Garden Training Center...Duties with the Rangers included preparing video, assisting with pre-scouting, tracking statistics and helping to coordinate team travel and scheduling...Also assisted in organizing and executing summer prospect camps, as well as setting up player rehab and off-season programs...Member of coaching staff of three ECAC-champion teams at Division III Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY)...Served as video coach for USA Hockey at 2006 World Junior Championships in Vancouver, B.C....Has coached at USA Select Festivals every summer since 2006 ...Assisted Pat Mikesch in coaching U.S. Under-17 Select Team to championship at the Under-18 Ivan Hlinka Tournament in Slovakia in August of 2013... Assisted Derek Plante in coaching U.S. Under-18 Select Team to championship at the Under-18 Ivan Hlinka Tournament in Slovakia/Czech Republic in August of 2014... As head coach, led U.S. Under-17 Select Team to championship at the Under-17 Five Nations Tournament in Arosa, Switzerland in August of 2015...Played college hockey at SUNY Potsdam...Born November 20, 1972 in Queens, NY.

Gord Murphy (Associate Head Coach): Named Wolf Pack associate head coach August 2, 2019...Prior to joining the Wolf Pack staff, had worked as an NHL assistant coach since 2002-03...Spent five seasons (2014-15 through 2018-19) on the staff of the Philadelphia Flyers, the last two working alongside current Wolf Pack head coach Kris Knoblauch as fellow assistants...Was a Florida Panther assistant coach for four years (2010-11 through 2013-14)...His first coaching experience was a seven-season (2002-03 through 2009-10) stint as an assistant with Columbus...Assistant coach for bronze medal-winning Canadian team in 2014 IIHF U18 World Championship...Enjoyed an 862-game career as an NHL defenseman, skating with Philadelphia, Florida, Boston and Atlanta, from 1988-89 through 2001-02 (85-238-323, 668 PIM)...Twice played for first-year expansion teams, in 1993-94 with Florida and 1999-00 with Atlanta...Went to Stanley Cup Final with Florida in 1995-96...Began his pro career in the AHL with Hershey in 1987-88, helping the Bears to a Calder Cup title and a 12-0 postseason run...Also played eight AHL games with Providence in his final year as a player (AHL career totals: 9-26-35, 52 PIM in 72 GP)...Drafted in 9th round (189th overall) by Philadelphia in 1985 out of the Ontario Hockey League, inwhich he played three seasons (1984-85 through 1986-87) for the Oshawa Generals...Born March 23, 1967 in Willowdale, Ontario.

David Cunniff Assistant Coach): Named Wolf Pack assistant coach August 21, 2019...Came to the Wolf Pack from the Iowa Wild, for which he worked for four seasons, the last three as associate coach...Was Iowa's head coach for 26 games in 2015-16 (9-12-2-3), after starting that season as an assistant...Assistant coach of the Albany Devils in 2014-15...Spent 12 seasons (2002-03 through 2013-14) with the San Jose Sharks' AHL affiliates...Associate coach of Worcester Sharks 2012-13 and 2013-14, after six seasons as assistant coach...Assistant coach of Cleveland Barons 2002-03 through 2005-06...Played five seasons of pro hockey as a forward (1996-97 through 1999-00 and 2001-02)...Suited up for 120 AHL games (5-20-25, 219 PIM) with the Albany River Rats from 1997-98 through 1999-00...Skated in 148 career ECHL contests (33-24-57, 336 PIM) with the Jacksonville Lizard Kings, Raleigh IceCaps, Louisiana IceGators and Richmond Renegades...Played Division III college hockey at Salem State...Father John Cunniff was a long-time pro player, coach and scout, including playing stints in the WHA with the New England Whalers and tenures as both head coach and assistant coach of the NHL's Hartford Whalers...Born October 9, 1970 in South Boston, MA.
