WILKES-BARRE/SCRANTON PENGUINS STAFF

J.D. FORREST - HEAD COACH

J.D. Forrest is entering his third season as head coach of the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins. It is also his seventh season with the club overall. Forrest, 41, spent the previous four seasons with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton as an assistant coach. Originally hired by the Penguins organization on Aug. 2, 2016, he officially earned promotion to the head coaching position on Sept. 11, 2020.

In his first four seasons as an assistant in Northeastern Pennsylvania, Forrest was responsible for mentoring the Penguins' defense and coaching the team's penalty kill unit. Forrest's penalty kill led the league in his first season behind the bench (2016-17) and had a top 10 success rate over the course of those four years as an assistant (82.8%).

Prior to joining Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, Forrest spent the 2015-16 season coaching Red Bull Salzburg's farm team in Austria. With Salzburg, Forrest went 32-22 in the international Red Bull Hockey Series and was unbeaten (4-0) in its season-ending tournament. Before coaching Salzburg's farm team, he served as an assistant coach for the U.S. National Team Development Program in 2014-15. While with the USNTDP, Forrest had the opportunity to mentor future top NHL draft picks Matthew Tkachuk, Clayton Keller, Luke Kunin and Auston Matthews. He won a gold medal with the team at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and has continued to maintain a coaching relationship with USA Hockey, as he has served on the U.S. coaching staff at the 2017 and 2021 Hlinka-Gretzky Cup, as well as various showcase events.

Forrest also played for the USNTDP before embarking on a successful collegiate career and nine years as a pro. In 2000, the Auburn, New York native was named NAHL Defenseman of the Year after leading the USNTDP-U18 team with 34 points. That summer, Forrest was drafted in the sixth round (181st overall) by the Carolina Hurricanes. He played four years at Boston College, where he led the team's defensemen in goals at the end of all four seasons and topped Eagles blueliners in points at the end of three. Forrest ultimately accrued 97 points (24G-73A) in 144 NCAA games and won the National Title in 2001. He went on to play for the Albany River Rats and Worcester Sharks in the AHL during the 2007-08 campaign. He also logged seasons as a pro overseas in Finland, Sweden, Switzerland and Germany.

KEVIN PORTER - ASSISTANT COACH

Kevin Porter is entering his third season behind the bench with the Penguins, all of which have been as a member of Forrest's staff. He was hired by Wilkes-Barre/Scranton on Jan. 11, 2021 after spending several months as a volunteer coach for the USNTDP-U18 club. The 36-year-old from Northville, Michigan had just wrapped up a 12-year career as a pro, including two decorated seasons in the Penguins organization.

Porter appeared in 85 contests with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton from 2015-2017. Porter was part of the Penguins' Kilpatrick Trophy-winning squad as regular season champions in 2016-17, a season in which he set a career-best with 46 points. He also played 43 games for the Pittsburgh Penguins from 2015-2017 and had his name engraved on the Stanley Cup after Pittsburgh's championship win in 2016. Porter earned 58 points (29G-29A) in 249 NHL games while playing for the Penguins, Phoenix Coyotes, Buffalo Sabres and Colorado Avalanche. He produced 354 points (129G-225A) in 528 AHL contests while suiting up for Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, the San Antonio Rampage, Lake Erie Monsters, Rochester Americans and Grand Rapids Griffins. Porter represented Rochester at the 2013 AHL All-Star Classic, and he captained the Americans in four seasons (2012-13; 2017-20).

A fourth-round draft pick (119th overall) by Phoenix in 2004, Porter first made a name for himself as a dominant player at the University of Michigan. In four years with the Wolverines, he notched 85 goals and 98 assists for 183 points across 162 games. He won the Hobey Baker Award as the best player in men's college hockey at the end of his senior season, 2007-08.

SHELDON BROOKBANK - ASSISTANT COACH

Sheldon Brookbank is beginning his first season as Penguins assistant coach, but this is his sixth season behind the bench overall. Brookbank, 42, spent parts of the past four seasons as an assistant coach in the NHL for the Chicago Blackhawks. The native of Lanigan, Saskatchewan was hired to his current post by Wilkes-Barre/Scranton on Aug. 5, 2022.

Brookbank had a 16-year pro playing career, during which he racked up 853 games at the ECHL, AHL, NHL and KHL levels. 351 of those contests were logged in the NHL, where he suited up for Chicago, the Nashville Predators, New Jersey Devils and Anaheim Ducks. Brookbank, an undrafted free agent, hoisted the Stanley Cup as a player for Chicago in 2013.

He appeared in 367 AHL games with the Grand Rapids Griffins, Milwaukee Admirals, Cincinnati Mighty Ducks, Lowell Devils and Cleveland Monsters. He won the Eddie Shore Award as the AHL's best defensemen in 2006-07 with Milwaukee, when he led all league blueliners 38 assists and 53 points.

Brookbank's brother, Wade, spent two seasons (2006-07, 2009-10) as a player with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, recording eight points (4G-4A) and 284 penalty minutes in 107 games.
