Ian Laperrière - Head Coach

Ian Laperrière is the 11th head coach in franchise history as the Phantoms embark on their 25th season since joining the American Hockey League as the Philadelphia Phantoms in 1996.

Laperrière had been an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Flyers for the last eight seasons since 2013-14 and had served as the team's Director of Player Development in the 2012-13 season. Previously, Laperrière was a hard-working forward who had long been regarded as one of the NHL's toughest players. He enjoyed a 15-year playing career in the NHL that encompassed 1,083 games in which he scored 121 goals with 215 assists for 336 points while accumulating 1,956 penalty minutes. He rates 58th all-time in NHL career penalty minutes and is 226th in games played. He was well-respected by teammates and considered a warrior throughout the league in a role that involved killing penalties, blocking shots and standing up for his teammates in skirmishes.

"We're very happy to have Ian serve as the next head coach of the Phantoms," said Chuck Fletcher, Philadelphia Flyers President of Hockey Operations and General Manager. "He has been an extremely dedicated individual to the Flyers organization and has shown a strong work ethic as a player, development coach and an assistant over the last 12 years for us. We are excited to have him at the forefront of developing our prospects, preparing them to reach the NHL and bringing success to Lehigh Valley."

Most of his time as a player in the NHL was with the Los Angeles Kings and Colorado Avalanche following shorter stints with the St. Louis Blues and New York Rangers. He culminated his playing career in 2009-10 with the Philadelphia Flyers appearing in all 82 games of the regular season and also 13 playoff games as the Flyers advanced to the Stanley Cup Final.

"Lappy" then missed two seasons as a player due to the aftereffects of injuries suffered in the first round of the 2010 playoffs when a shot hit him in the face in a game against the New Jersey Devils. He remained active within the organization mentoring the club's prospects while also dabbling in television analysis. Following the 2010-11 season, even though he did not play in a single game all season, Laperrière won the Bill Masterton Trophy for his perseverance, sportsmanship, and dedication to hockey. He had also been named by The Hockey News as the toughest player in the NHL (John Ferguson Award) for the 2009-10 season.

Laperrière, 47, hails from Montreal and was a round 7 selection of the St. Louis Blues in the 1992 NHL Entry Draft. Ian and his wife, Magali, have two sons named Tristan and Zachary. He was sworn in as a naturalized U.S. citizen in 2011.

Riley Armstrong - Assistant Coach

Riley Armstrong, 36, was the first head coach for the new Maine Mariners of the ECHL and guided the team to a record of 69-58-7 in the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons. He also was promoted to assistant general manager for his second season with the team working alongside Mariners general manager Danny Brière.

Armstrong had previously served as assistant coach of the Wheeling Nailers in the ECHL from 2016-18. A product of Saskatoon, Sask. Armstrong played 12 seasons of professional hockey including 404 games in the American Hockey League scoring 86 goals and 81 assists for 167 career points. Most of his AHL playing days were with the Cleveland Barons and Worcester Sharks. He also played in two games in the NHL with the San Jose Sharks in 2008-09. He ended his professional playing career in 2015-16 with the Reading Royals where he played in 26 games.

Jason Smith - Assistant Coach

Jason Smith, 47, is a veteran of over 1,000 NHL games with the New Jersey Devils, Toronto Maple Leafs, Edmonton Oilers, Philadelphia Flyers and Ottawa Senators. The rugged defenseman scored 41 goals with 128 assists for 169 career points while accumulating 1,099 penalty minutes.

Smith was captain of the Edmonton Oilers for five seasons and with the Philadelphia Flyers for one year in 2007-08. He helped guide the Oilers in their surprising run to the 2006 Stanley Cup Finals. Two seasons later, he sparked a rejuvenated Flyers team to a record of 42-29-11 and an appearance in the Eastern Conference Finals.

The Calgary, Alta. native was an assistant coach with the Ottawa Senators for two seasons from 2014-16 and then was head coach of the Kelowna Rockets of the WHL for three years followed by his most recent stint as an associate coach with the Prince George Cougars of the WHL for the past two years.

Bill Downey – Assistant Coach / Director of Hockey Operations

Downey, 40, is entering his sixth season with the Phantoms. In October, 2021 he was named as an Assistant Coach while also continuing as Director of Hockey Operations. A native of Pittsburgh, Downey spent four seasons as Director of Hockey Operations at Penn State before coming to the Phantoms.

He had also been an assistant coach with the Penn State club hockey for two seasons and had previously been an assistant coach with the Reading Royals in 2007-08. Downey played 77 games of professional hockey from 2004-08, mostly with Wheeling of the ECHL.
