Head-to-head:

This is the first of eight meetings between the Wolf Pack and the Checkers this season. The sides will not meet again until Jan. 28 at PeoplesBank Arena. A season ago, the foes split eight games. The Wolf Pack collected points in five of the eight meetings, posting a record of 4-3-1-0. The Checkers, meanwhile, went 4-2-1-1 in the head-to-head matchup. The Wolf Pack won the first four head-to-head meetings, then the Checkers won the last four. They enter tonight's contest with a four-game winning streak against the Wolf Pack. The Checkers claimed a 3-2 victory in Hartford in the most recent meeting on Apr. 16. John Leonard and Oliver Okuliar struck in the opening frame, giving the Checkers a 2-0 lead through 20 minutes. Anton Blidh got the Wolf Pack on the board 16:38 into the middle stanza, but Okuliar's second goal of the season less than two minutes later restored the two-goal lead. Adam Sýkora made it 3-2 at 12:11 of the third period, but Kaapo Kähkönen slammed the door shut to preserve the two points for the visitors. The Wolf Pack posted a record of 2-2-0-0 in four home games against the Checkers a season ago.

Wolf Pack Notebook:

The Wolf Pack erupted for a season-high six goals on Saturday night, doubling up the Springfield Thunderbirds 6-3 at the MassMutual Center. Corey Schueneman opened the scoring 13:36 into the game, sneaking a shot by Dylan Garand through traffic, but five unanswered goals allowed the Wolf Pack to pull away. Dylan Roobroeck deflected a Brett Berard shot by Georgi Romanov 16:15 into first, tying the game 1-1 on the power play. Blake Hillman then gave the Wolf Pack the lead for good at 18:30, tapping home a backdoor pass to make it 2-1. Brendan Brisson, Carey Terrance, and Gabe Perreault all scored in a span of 1:42 to extend the lead to 5-1 by the 2:26 mark of the second period. Leo Lööf stopped the bleeding at 3:39 of the second period, but Bryce McConnell-Barker made it 6-2 at 7:55. Dalibor Dvorský struck on the power play at 14:55 of the third period, making it 6-3, but that was as close as the T-Birds drew it. The Wolf Pack held the Thunderbirds to just 15 shots, the fewest allowed in a game this season.

Checkers Notebook:

The Checkers were swept in a two-game set against the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins in North Carolina over the weekend. After losing 4-0 on Friday night, the Checkers were able to gain a point in a 3-2 overtime loss on Saturday evening. **Brian Pinho** broke the ice at 2:19 of the first period for the Checkers, but Tristan Broz quickly countered at 5:11. Colton Huard reestablished the lead 2:08 into the second period for the home side, but a power play strike from **Danton Heinen** at 10:03 would tie the game and eventually force overtime. In the extra session, **Ville Koivunen** potted his fourth goal of the season at 3:28 to keep the Penguins undefeated. The loss dropped the Checkers to 3-2-1-0 on the season.
