### Head-to-head:

This is the third of six meetings between the Wolf Pack and the Phantoms this season. It is the third and final visit to the Connecticut capital for the Phantoms. The series shifts to Allentown, PA, on Saturday, Dec. 20. The Phantoms won each of the first two meetings in overtime, with both games ending with 4-3 scores. Lane Pederson scored the game-winning goal 36 seconds into overtime in the first meeting on Oct. 31, capping a 3-1 comeback for the visitors. Cooper Marody then scored the overtime game-winning goal at 3:08 of the extra session on Nov. 1. The goal was Marody's first of the season, and was unassisted. In both meetings, the Wolf Pack led in the third period, but Carl Grundström struck on the power play on both occasions to force overtime. The sides combined for 60 penalty minutes in their most recent meeting on Nov. 1.

### **Wolf Pack Notebook:**

The Wolf Pack picked up their second straight win on Friday night, 5-2 at home over the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins. Trailing 2-1 in the second period, Trey Fix-Wolansky tied the game at 8:18 with his team-leading sixth goal of the season. Anton Blidh then tipped home a Cooper Moore shot at 13:21, giving the Wolf Pack the lead for good. Brett Berard and Adam Sýkora struck in the final stanza, providing the Wolf Pack with the needed insurance. Callum Tung made 31 saves, improving to 2-0-0 on the season. The Wolf Pack surrendered a season-high 22 shots in the first period, but Tung made 21 saves. Derrick Pouliot recorded three points in the victory (1 g, 2 a). He is the second Wolf Pack player to score three points in a game this season. The club is now 2-1-1-0 on their season-long six-game homestand. The Wolf Pack has outscored opponents 4-0 in the third period over their last two games.

### **Phantoms Notebook:**

The Phantoms dropped a 3-2 decision to Providence Bruins in Rhode Island last night. Jake Schmaltz opened the scoring just 2:20 into the game for the Bruins, scoring his second goal of the season. Karsen Dorwart responded with a power play strike at 3:59 for the Phantoms, but Patrick Brown's power play goal at 8:51 would give the Bruins the lead for good. Jacob Perreault's first goal as a Bruin came at 4:33 of the third period, extending the lead to 3-1. That insurance marker would prove valuable, as it ended up as the game-winning goal. Anthony Richard drew the Phantoms within one at 17:48, but it would not be enough to spark a rally. The Phantoms are 5-3-1-1 on the road this season. Tonight is their eleventh road contest, the most of any team in the Atlantic Division.
